Opening Remarks

We are pleased to report grants and contracts totalling **\$27,095,992** for the fiscal year that ended June 30, 2000. This figure is the highest ever for Hunter College. This record occurs at a time when federal oversight on research projects is on the rise and competition is increasing. We congratulate everyone for navigating difficult waters very successfully.

Thanks to excellent faculty leadership and effort, the College has been awarded a number of multiple investigator awards that will contribute substantially to our efforts in research, student support, teaching, and outreach. Examples of their collaborative efforts include:

- Faculty from the departments of Biological Sciences, Chemistry, Physics & Astronomy, and Psychology competed successfully for MIDARP, SCORE, and RISE grants from NIH.
- A successful collaboration between the School of Social Work and the Brookdale Center on Aging brought support from the Hartford Foundation for education in geriatric social work.
- School of Education faculty were given increased funding for ongoing and new projects with local schools in efforts to improve teacher performance in urban settings.
- New initiatives in health were funded in the Schools of the Health Professions and its related centers.

This report would not be complete without recognizing the members of the Committee for the Protection of Human Subjects from Research Risks and the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee who have the task of reviewing numerous funded and unfunded projects to make sure that regulations are followed. The Committee lists for the last year are found on the *Additional Acknowledgements* page near the end of this report. We also thank the faculty on the policy and research committees in the many departments and schools which conduct pre-reviews and provide colleagues and students with valuable feedback to improve their research protocols and proposals.

This was a year marked by the departures of President **David Caputo**, who has left to preside over Pace University, and Associate Provost **Stephen Zoloth**, who was appointed Dean of Health Sciences at Northeastern University. We were buoyed by the successful completion of several searches in key areas of the College. These people, working closely with Interim President **Evangelos J. Gizis**, will clearly have a positive impact on grant and contract proposal submissions in the years to come.

A Note from the Director

The start of a new year, not to mention a century and, yes, a millenium, makes one pause and take a moment to look back. Just a quarter century ago, Hunter College's annual total for grants and contracts approximated \$3 million based on fewer than 75 projects. During the 1980-1989 period, our awards tripled when compared to the previous decade, and during the nineties they have risen another by another two-thirds when compared to the eighties.

It is hard to believe that the amount of tuition support for students in our 1999-2000 grant awards alone is as large as our total grant figure for all purposes in 1980. What a tremendous increase! In fact, grants were connected with 1,088 actions involving coverage of student tuition divided over the fall, spring and summer terms. What a tribute to our faculty proposal writers who try so hard to help their students!

It is incredible that our treasured **PSC-CUNY Research Award Program**, which in recent years has given grants averaging under \$5,000, has now awarded **more than \$10 million** to Hunter projects since the inception of the program three decades ago.

Despite the retirement incentives of the last decade, recruiting in recent years has brought us a talented group of faculty members who are already having an impact on Hunter's grant activity.

The new century will not be easy. We will all be challenged by the electronic transmission of grant proposals, by new federal requirements for training all researchers involved in human subjects research, and by federal concerns on financial conflict of interest. On the horizon there is a myriad of other technology-related changes. The Hunter faculty and staff have an excellent track record of cutting through "red tape" and overcoming obstacles of all sorts.

Our *Annual Report of Grants & Contracts* for Fiscal Year 2000 -- a banner year of more than \$27 million! The Office of Research Administration is delighted to provide this report. We hope you find the report to be of interest and value in providing an outline of the extramural and intramural support activity generated by our faculty and staff.

Section I-A: Overview of External Funding

This section contains statistical information on grants and contracts from external sources, i.e., agencies of Federal, State, and City governments, foundations, corporations, and non-profit organizations. For the sake of making comparisons, figures are given for the quarter century beginning July 1, 1975.

Grants and contracts have undergone remarkable growth since the late 1970's. Viewing awards in ten-year increments, we used 1980 as the initial base year to illustrate growth:

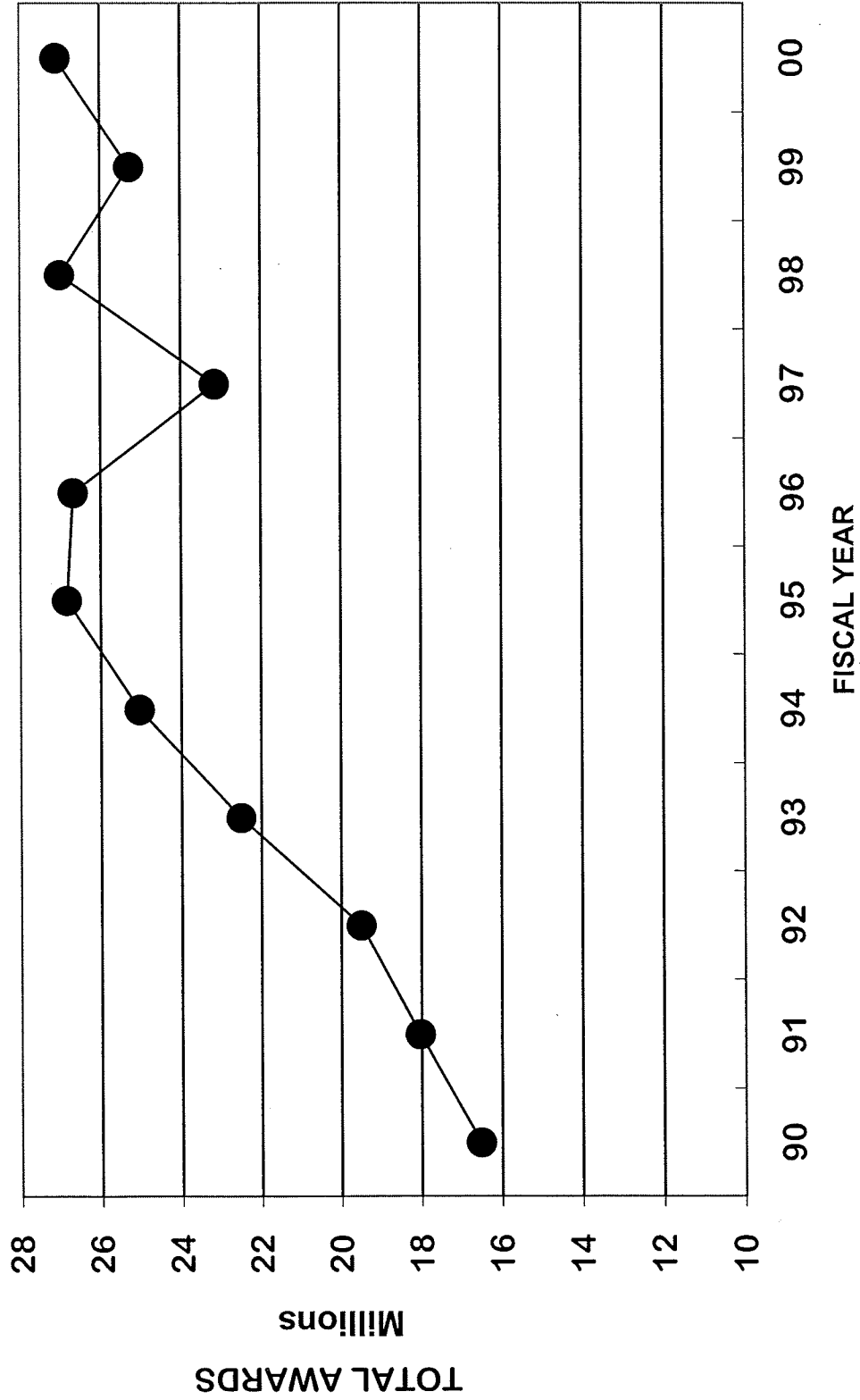

The "mix" of the source of grants has also undergone tremendous change. In 1980, Federal grants represented 83% of that year's grants. In 2000, Federal grants constituted only 45% of our \$27,095,992.

DOLLAR VOLUME

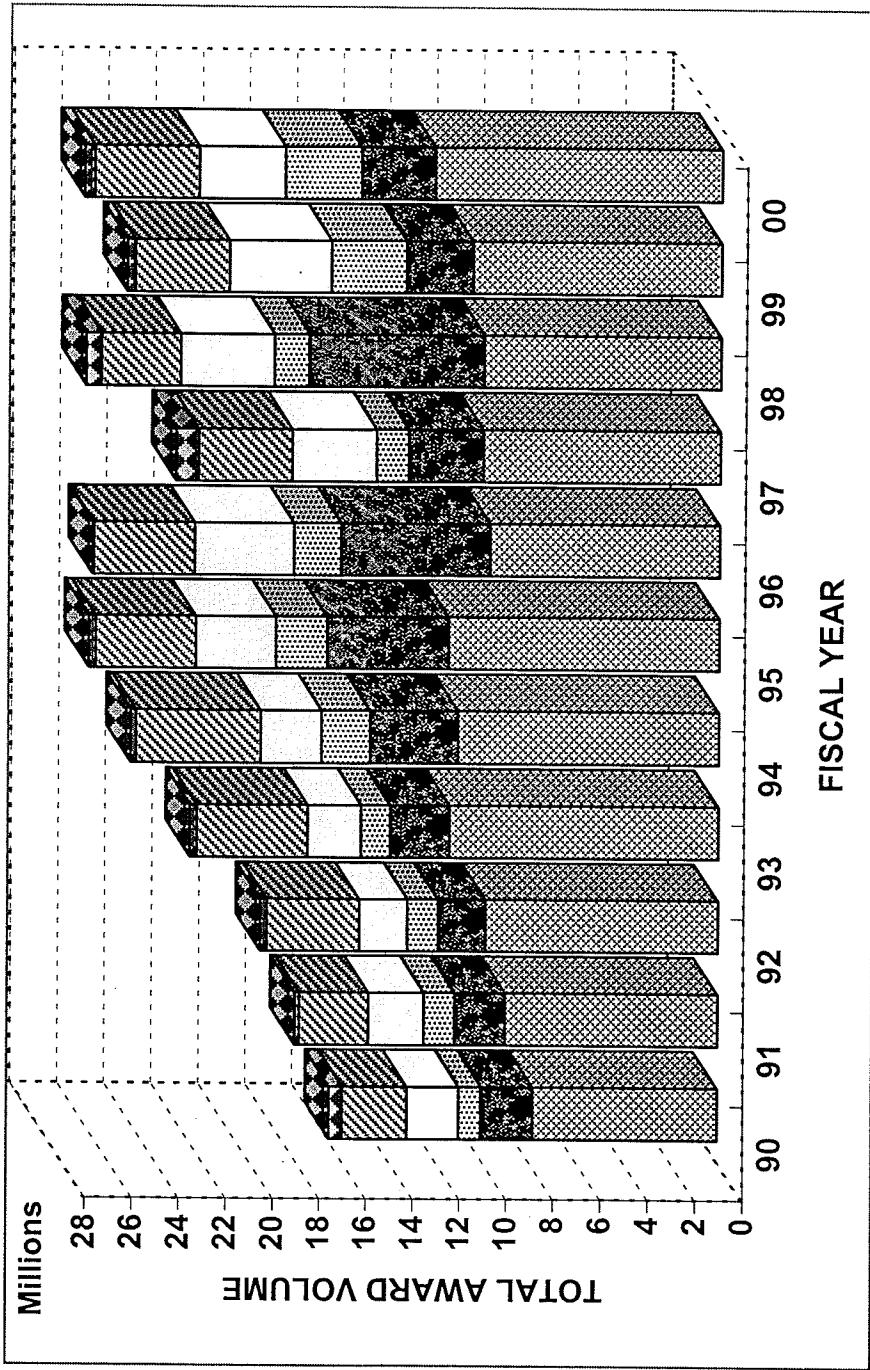

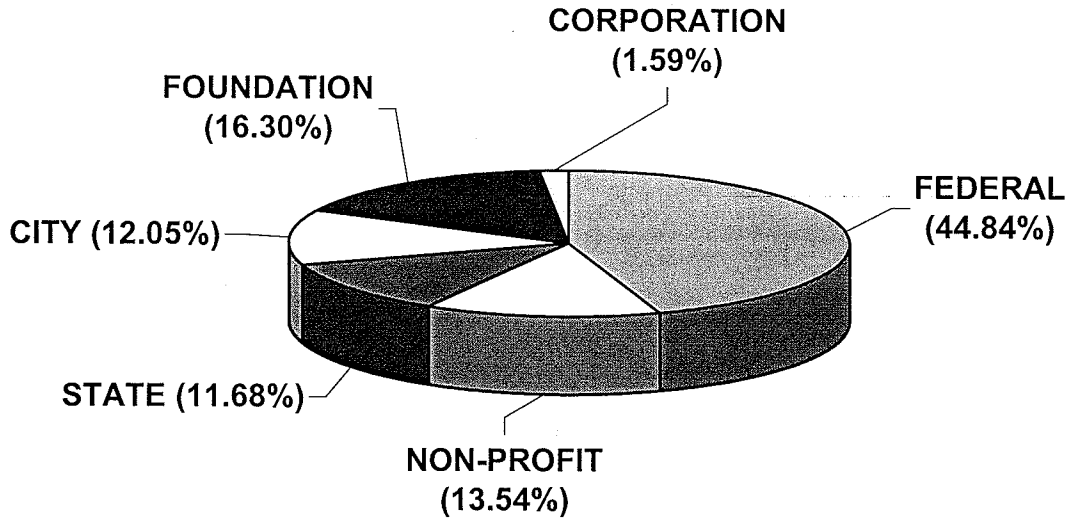

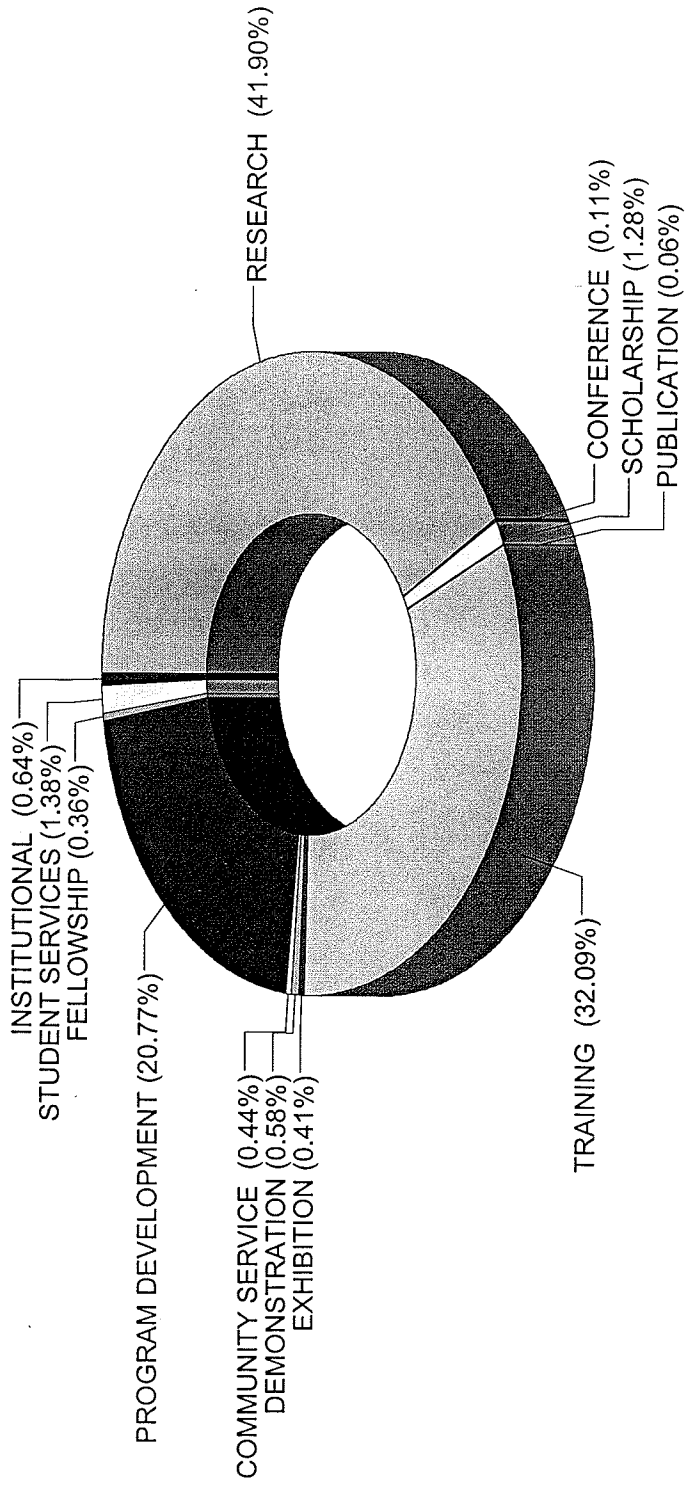

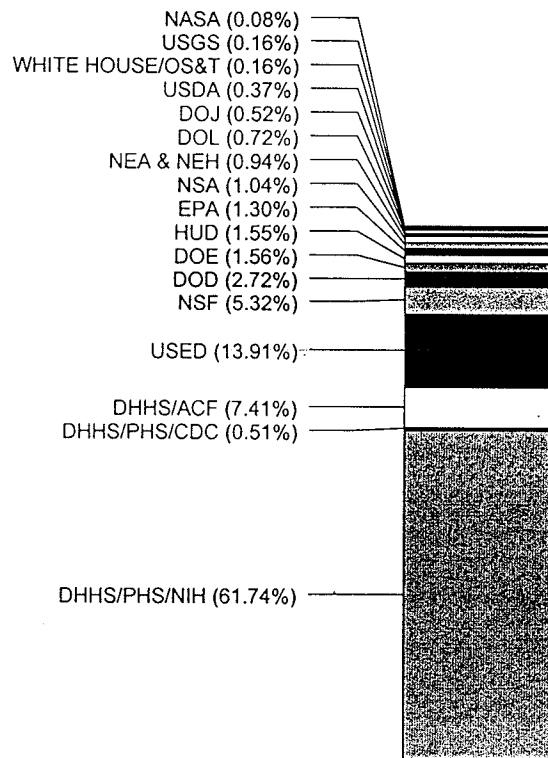
