
Message from the President

Once again, Hunter's scholars and researchers have achieved a new level of success in attracting grant and contract awards for their cutting edge work. In Fiscal Year 2003 we reached an impressive total of \$40.77 million for projects led by Hunter College faculty and staff, an increase of 8%.

With these funds, Hunter College faculty and staff advance the knowledge and thinking – and break new ground – in their fields. Hunter's researchers have an excellent record in basic and applied research, and collaborate with faculty from the nation's leading research universities. They serve on review panels for federal agencies and, perhaps most important, transmit their enthusiasm for learning and inquiry to our students.

The breadth and high level of Hunter's expertise is demonstrated by the range of funding received to develop programs and implement training projects, not only in the liberal arts and sciences, but also in the preparation of counselors, educational administrators, teachers, health and mental health professionals, nurses and social workers.

We congratulate everyone at Hunter whose strong commitment to research, scholarship and teaching helped to establish this new benchmark.

Opening Remarks

A record number of faculty submitted proposals in the 2002-2003 academic year, and the results were outstanding. Hunter faculty and staff were awarded the largest number of grants and contracts in the College's history. A total of 475 awards were received from federal, state, city, and private agencies surpassing the \$40 million level.

Grants and contracts bring vitality to the College. The success of the members of our faculty demonstrates that they are in step with the latest findings in research as well as practices and techniques that translate to the classroom and laboratory.

Most members of the Hunter community are aware of the importance to Hunter students of training grants, which are frequently accompanied by scholarship support or stipends. It is not generally known that our grants provide more than 250 jobs to students.

We acknowledge everyone who develops ideas and writes proposals and who serves on the various review committees in government, the private sector and within the City University of New York. We also salute faculty and staff who serve on Hunter's Institutional Review Board, the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee, and the Institutional Biohazards Committee. Their service is greatly appreciated.

Director's Remarks

Fiscal Year 2003 showed a continued upswing in Hunter grants and contracts. While being directly awarded \$40.77 million by sources outside the City University system, Hunter continued to participate in various projects within the University for which it received more than \$3.57 million, bringing the overall total to \$44,346,615.

Some of the highlights of 2002-2003:

- ◆ Within a period of three weeks, we were notified of three CAREER awards for junior faculty in Biological Sciences, Chemistry, and Computer Science.
- ◆ Faculty members from Anthropology and Film & Media Studies became MacArthur Fellows, and one of them also received an NEH Fellowship.
- ◆ Two Javits Fellowship recipients (grants sponsored by the U. S. Education Department) chose to do their graduate work in Art and in Creative Writing at Hunter.
- ◆ A Physics faculty member was recognized in a White House ceremony for mentoring students.
- ◆ A major international scientific conference on birdsong was held at Hunter with support from two federal agencies.
- ◆ New initiatives in the areas of HIV research and on environmental health issues received support.
- ◆ The Center for Puerto Rican Studies collaborated with other CUNY schools in a major study.

The outlook for 2003-2004 is also quite good. As we prepare to "go to press," just in the last month (mid-February to mid-March, 2004):

- ◆ A senior faculty member was notified of a high score on a new proposal he had recently submitted – the likelihood is that a four-year research grant will result.
- ◆ Two junior faculty members became recipients of nationally recognized fellowships.
- ◆ Another junior faculty member received an award notice for a five-year grant from the National Institutes of Health for a research project.
- ◆ Within a week, faculty members were featured in **The New York Times Science Times** and on NBC's *Today Show*.

These events point up the excellent work being done by our faculty and staff.



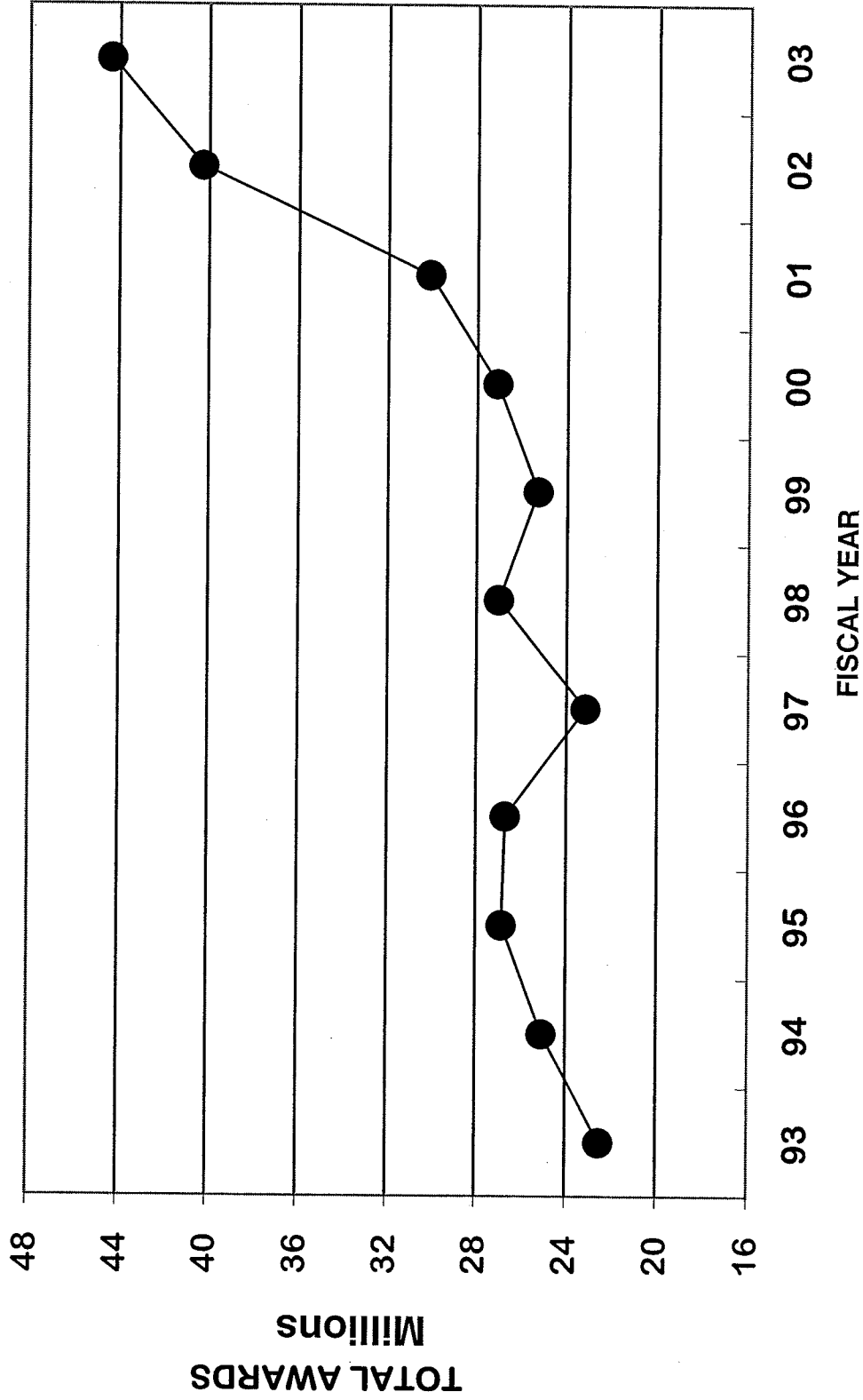
Grants and contracts have undergone remarkable growth since the late 1970s. Viewing awards in ten year increments, we used 1983 as the initial base year to illustrate growth.

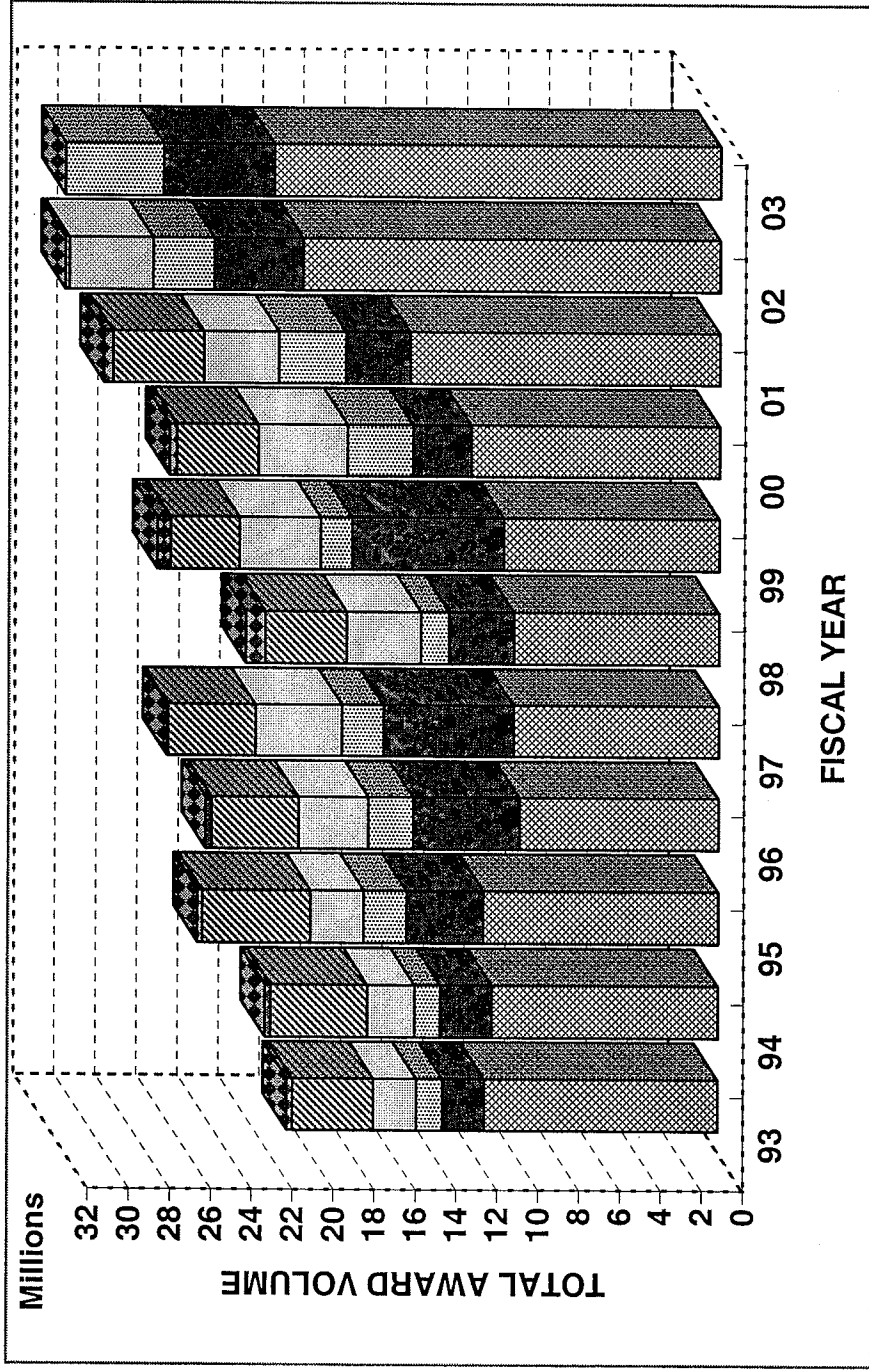

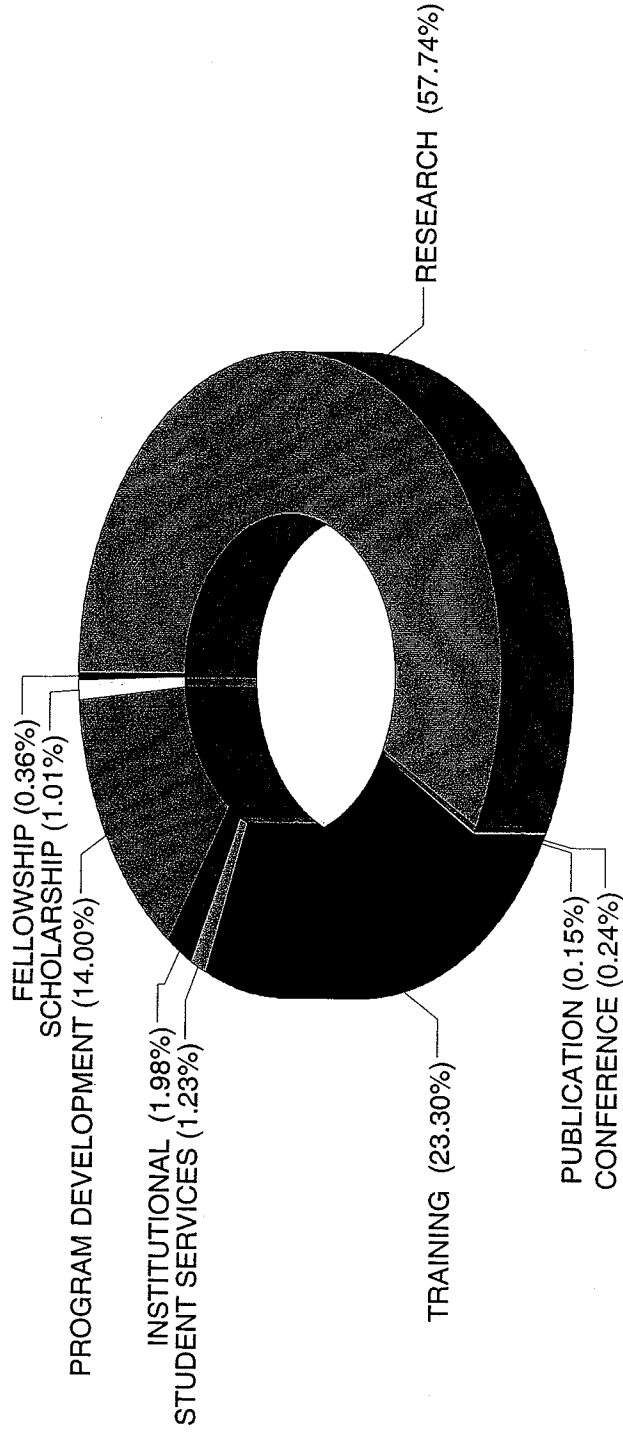
