
Message from the President

Administering a project is not easy. Principal Investigators and Project Directors are bombarded with paper and electronic mail which must be handled. Personnel activity reports and financial disclosure forms have been a fact for more than a decade, and training requirements for all researchers on projects involving human subjects are a reality. New training protocols are on the horizon. Electronic proposal transmission is a requirement at the National Science Foundation, and it is being tested at other federal agencies and even in our own PSC-CUNY Research Award Program. The CUNY Research Foundation has moved heavily into electronic research administration. The staff of Research Administration joins me in saluting all who make the extra effort to meet these requirements.

While CUNY recognizes grant originating at Hunter in its statistics, faculty and staff also received individual awards and participated in a variety of CUNY grants and State-supported programs at a level of approximately \$5 million. 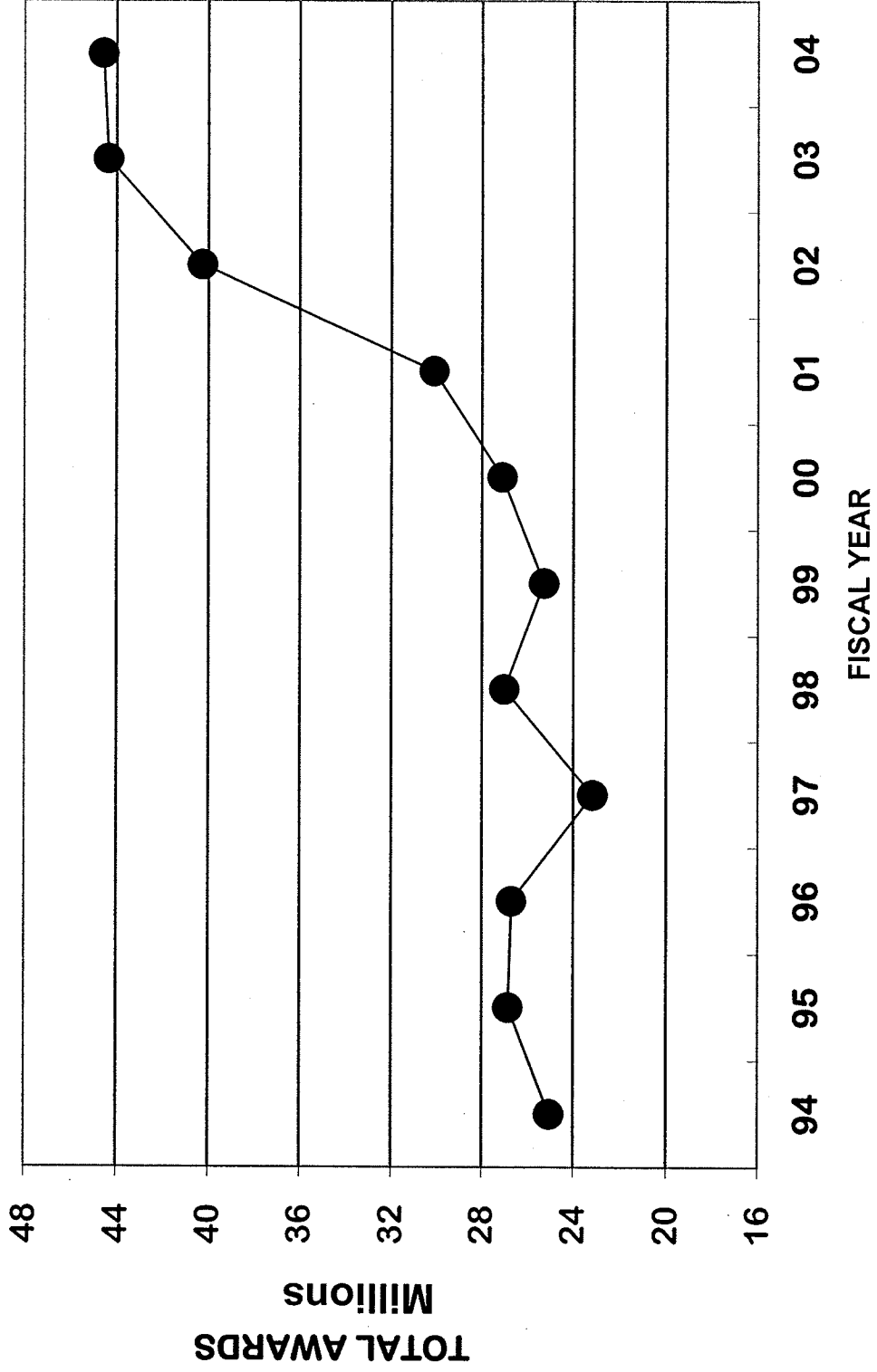
Grants and contracts have undergone remarkable growth during this period. Viewing awards in ten year increments, we used 1984 as the initial base year to illustrate growth.

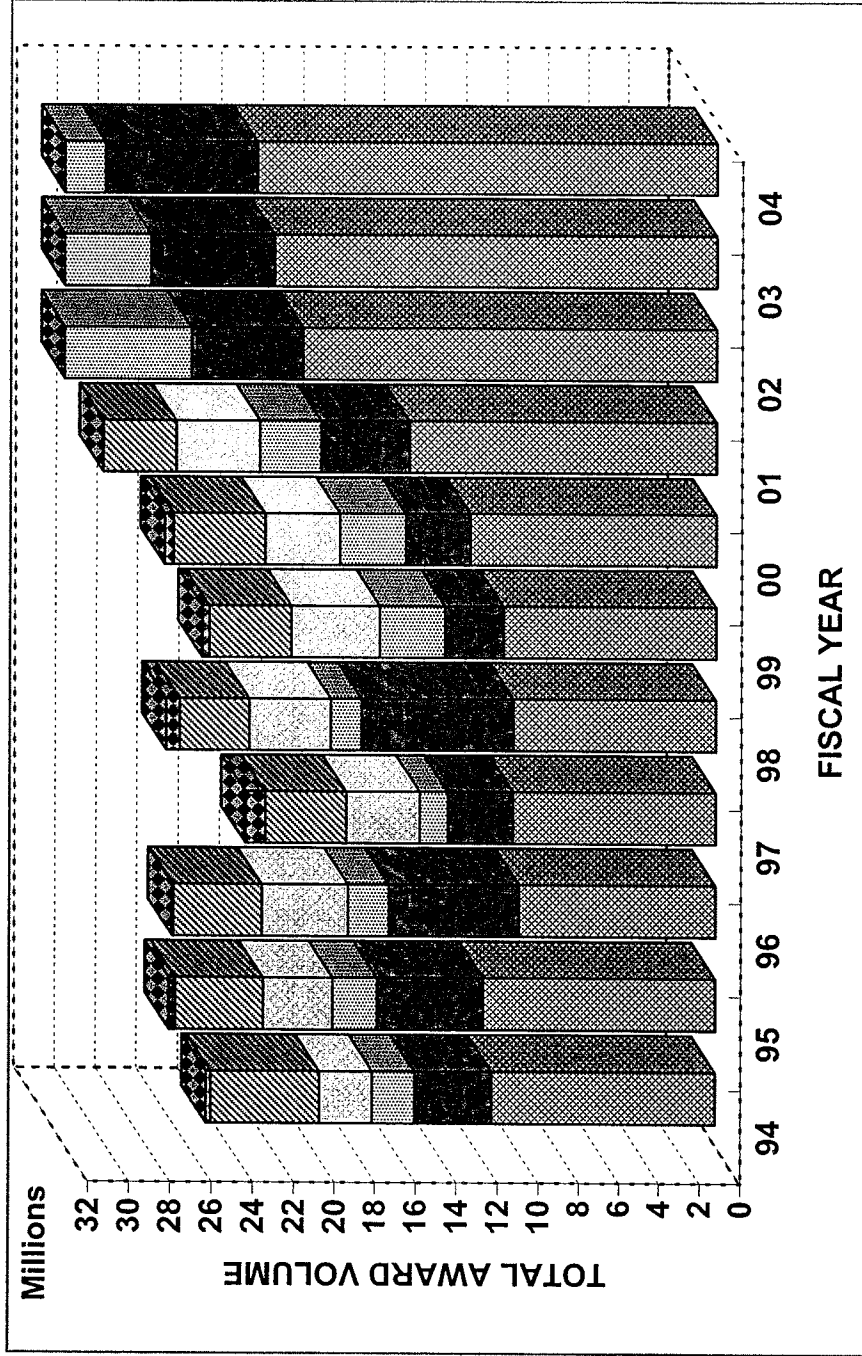

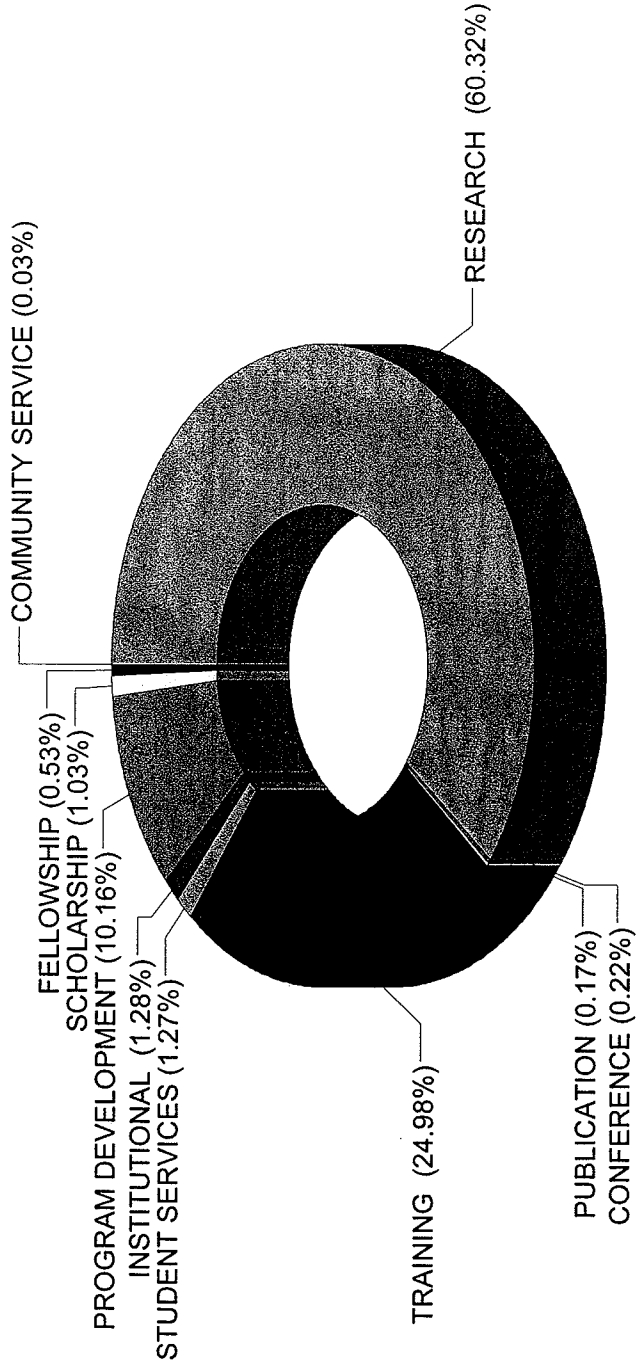
